### 1. The Organising Authority

1.1. The Organising Authority (OA) will be the Royal Yachting Association in conjunction with the relevant Sailing Clubs.

### 3. Event Grading

World Sailing Grading, as stated in NOR 2, for each event has been applied for.

This grading is subject to review by World Sailing. The events may be re-graded at any time when there is clear reason to do so.

### 4. Provisional Programme

#### 4.1. Schedule

- a) The Race Office will be open from 0800 on each day of the events.
- b) Registration for each event will be, as per NOR 2.
- c) Crew weighing to be completed by the close of registration for each event, as detailed in NOR 2.
- d) Practice may be available on the afternoon prior to the first day each event. Contact the OA for availability and costs.
- e) First briefing for each event will be, as per NOR 2.
- f) First briefing with the umpires for each event will be immediately after completion of the first briefing.
- g) Racing days for each event will be, as per NOR 2.
- h) The time of the first race on all days will be 0900, unless extended by the OA.
- i) Daily press conference may take place 60 minutes after the completion of the final race of the day.
- j) Prize giving on completion of the press conference.

#### 4.2. Unless excused by the OA attendance at the following is mandatory.

- a) First briefing for skippers.
- b) Daily briefing for skippers.
- c) Daily press conference for skippers.



- d) Prize giving for final skippers and crews.

## 5. Skippers Eligibility and Entries

- 5.1. The number of skippers to be invited to each event is detailed in NOR 2. Only skippers accepted by the OA will be eligible to enter the appropriate event.
- 5.2. The registered skipper shall helm the boat at all times while racing, except in an emergency. Such an emergency shall be reported to the OA immediately after completion of that race.
- 5.3. For an entry to be valid the online entry form must be completed correctly and must be submitted to the OA with all the required information completed..
- The non-refundable entry fee shall be paid upon entry and agreement to the damage deposit indemnity shall be required for this to be valid.
  - Withdrawal: When a skipper accepts an invitation and later withdraws within two months of the event or leaves before the end without written approval from the OA, a zero score may be applied to their Ranking points for that event by World Sailing (World Sailing Regulation 27.2).
  - All competitors shall meet the eligibility requirements of World Sailing Regulation 19.2.
  - Teams for all SMR and U19 shall include at least one female sailor (or who identifies as female).
  - Skippers shall obtain a World Sailing Sailor ID by registering [online](#). Skippers shall inform the OA of their World Sailing ID no later than 7 days before the event is due to start unless excused by the OA.
  - Damage Deposit, see addendum A
  - All crew must register online for each event at least 7 days before the event is due to start, unless excused by the OA.
  - All crew must be at least 14 years old, unless a parent/guardian is sailing in the same boat. Any sailor under the age of 18 years old shall complete [a parent/guardian declaration form](#) before attending the event.
  - Staged entries:
    - 5.3.i.1. Stage 1 (early bird offer) entry fees are valid until 23.59 4 weeks before an event. (For example, Winter Match Racing 1 (WMR1) - stage 1 entry deadline is 23.59 on the 18<sup>th</sup> December 2021. Stage 2 entries will close 23.59 1 week before the event. (For example, WMR1 stage 2 entry deadline is 23.59 on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2022). Entries received after this may be accepted at the sole discretion of the OA. There will be no staged entry for the Grand Finals.
  - Skippers and crews failing to meet the deadlines in 5.3 shall be deemed to be withdrawing from the event without approval as per 5.3(b)
- 5.4. The OA intends to accept entries on a first come first served basis until the event stage 1 entry deadline.

### U19 Championships

- 5.5. All crew and skippers for the **U19 Championships** shall be aged at least 14 years old but under 19 years old on the first day of the event.

### Harken Youth Championships

- 5.6. All crew and skippers for the **Harken Youth Championships** shall be aged at least 14 years old but under 22 years old, by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022, i.e. born after 31/12/2000. Teams wishing to be considered for selection to the World Sailing Youth Match Racing Championships or Eurosaf Youth Match Racing championships shall meet the crew criteria in their respective NORs.

### Marlow Ropes Women's Championships

- 5.7. All crew and skippers for the **Marlow Ropes Women's Championships** shall be female or identify as female.

### Grand Finals

- 5.8. Skippers Eligibility for the RYA National Match Racing Championship **Grand Finals**
- Only skippers invited by the OA are eligible for the Championship Grand Finals. Up to sixteen (16) skippers' entries will be accepted. Skippers shall be British passport holders, or eligible to receive a British passport. Their crew shall be British passport holders, or eligible to receive a British passport, or resident in the UK, for at least 6 months in the previous 12 months prior to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022.
  - A skipper may be invited for the Finals from:-
    - Is placed first GBR skipper in an RYA Winter Match Racing 2022 Series event (WMR1, WMR2, WMR3, Women's WMR and BUCS Championships)
    - Is placed first GBR skipper in an RYA Summer Match Racing 2022 Series event (SMR1, SMR2, SMR3, U19, Youths, Women's)
    - Is placed first GBR skipper at the Moody Decking Schools Match Racing Championships 2021.
    - Is the highest ranked GBR skipper on the World Sailing Match Racing Ranking list (July 2022)
    - Is the current defending National Match Racing Grand Finals skipper.
    - a past winning skipper from the National Match Racing Grand Finals.
  - Should a skipper qualify for the Finals from more than one event, the skipper shall qualify for the Finals, from their first qualifying event.



- d) Finalists qualifying in 1<sup>st</sup> place through 2022 qualifiers will receive a discounted entry fee of £600. Finalists invited from the World Sailing Match Racing rankings, past winners and wildcards will be required to pay an entry fee of £650.
- e) The OA reserves the right to allocate wildcard entries and remaining places to the Finals, in a manner that it sees fit. Applications for wildcards must be [submitted online](#) or emailed to the Keelboat Racing Team ([keelboatracing@rya.org.uk](mailto:keelboatracing@rya.org.uk)) by 1st October 2022.

## 6. Rules

### 6.1.

- a) The events will be governed by the rules as defined in the RRS, including Appendix C.
- b) The 'Rules for the Handling of Boats' will apply, and will also apply to any practice sailing.
- c) The RYA prescriptions and RYA Racing Charter shall apply.
- d) The bye-laws of the host club for each event shall apply. **(Note: Personal floatation devices approved by the National Testing Authority or equivalent must be worn at all times whilst afloat and when on the pontoons.)**

### 6.2. Major Alterations to the RRS:

- a) Add to RRS 41: (f) information provided by the designated RYA Coach or umpires.
- b) RRS C8.6 and C6.3 will be changed in the sailing instructions.

## 7. Boats and Sails

- 7.1. The events will be sailed in the boats stated in NOR 2.
- 7.2. 4 to 8 boats will be provided.
- 7.3. The following sails will be provided for each boat:- Mainsail, Jib and spinnaker.
- 7.4. Boats will be allocated by draw either daily or for each round as decided by the Race Committee.

## 8. Crew (including skipper)

- 8.1. The number and total weight of crew (including skipper) as stated in NOR 2 for each event, dressed in at least shorts and shirts, shall not exceed the maximum weight limit, determined at the time of registration or such time as required by the RC. All registered crew shall sail all races.
- 8.2. Crew weight may be checked during the event. At any re-weighing the total weight limit is increased by 10kgs. Any crew weighing in excess of this increased limit shall not be penalised, but they shall reduce their weight to the increased limit before racing again.
- 8.3. When a registered skipper is unable to continue helming in the event, the OA may authorise an original crew member to be their substitute.
- 8.4. When a registered crew member is unable to continue in the event, the OA may authorise a substitute, a temporary substitute or other adjustment.

## 9. Event Format

- 9.1. Skippers will be seeded into a round robin or divided into groups based on the World Sailing ranking list 30 days before the appropriate event.
- 9.2. Each event will likely consist of the following stages:-
  - a) Series 1 - Single Round Robin
  - b) Series 2 - Semi-Finals
  - c) Series 3 – Finals
- 9.3. The RC may change the format, terminate or eliminate any stage or the event when, in its opinion, it is impractical to attempt to hold the remainder of the matches under the existing conditions or the remaining time scheduled. Early stages may be terminated in favour of later stages.

## 10. Course

- 10.1. The course will be windward/leeward with starboard roundings, finishing downwind.
- 10.2. The intended course area will be published in the relevant event's Sailing Instructions.

## 11. Advertising

- 11.1. As boats and equipment will be supplied by the OA, World Sailing Regulation 20.4. applies. Each boat will be required to display advertising as supplied by the OA.
- 11.2. Competitors may be permitted to display advertising ashore at the venue, but this is subject to individual negotiation with the OA.
- 11.3. Boats shall not be permitted the right to protest for breaches of any rules regarding advertising (amends RRS 60.1).

## 12. Prizes

- 12.1. Prizes may be awarded at the Championships Grand Final. Prizes may also be awarded at the U19, Harken Youths, Marlow Ropes Women's and Moody Decking Schools events.
- 12.2. The OA may reduce a prize in the case of misconduct or refusal to comply with any reasonable request, including attendance at official functions.



### 13. Media, Images and Sound

13.1. If required by the OA:

- a) The OA may require television personnel and equipment (or dummies) to be carried on board while racing and may require competitors to be available for interviews.

13.2. The OA have the right to use any images and sound recorded during the event free of any charge.

### 14. Coach Boats

14.1. Coach boats shall conspicuously display identification of the team being coached.

14.2. The OA will not provide berths for coach boats.

14.3. Any interference by a coach boat with the racing or event organisation may result in a penalty applied at the discretion of the Protest Committee to the appropriate skipper or team.

### 15. Risk Statement

Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accepts responsibility for the exposure of themselves and their crew to such inherent risk while taking part in the event.
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew and any property they may bring, whether afloat or ashore.
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.
- d) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities
- e) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances
- f) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for this event.
- g) It is their responsibility to ensure that they are familiar with the type of boat used, and the supplied equipment and are suitably experienced with its operation.
- h) It is their responsibility for ensuring all supplied equipment is carried on board.
- i) That they are fit to sail and that they believe the crew and the boat and crew is capable of competing in the anticipated conditions.
